CREATION

Arizona's Opportunity Zones were created through a provision in the U.S. Tax Cuts & Jobs Act of 2017.

- Governor Ducey designated the ACA to lead the collaborative statewide effort to identify and submit Arizona's Opportunity Zones plan to the U.S. Treasury
- Arizona became one of the first states to have its Opportunity Zones officially designated on April 9, 2018

Opportunity Zones legislation provides capital gains benefits to encourage investors to:

- Sell passively held investments
- Reinvest capital gains from those investments in property or businesses in select lowerincome communities called Opportunity Zones

Investing in Opportunity Zones requires the use of an intermediary vehicle called an Opportunity Fund.





GUIDANCE

CRITICAL U.S. TREASURY ROLE

Guidance from the U.S. Treasury is critical to the success of Opportunity Zones.

Guidance updated in February 2019:

- Allows Opportunity Funds to form
- Makes multi-year projects feasible
- Makes rehab projects more desirable
- Makes feasible investing in businesses that are largely, but not wholly, in Opportunity Zones

DETAILS & CLARIFICATIONS

The Spring 2019 guidance clarified:

- Tax implications of interim gains and rules for reinvestment
- How several key provisions and rules apply to investments in operating businesses
- How to invest in projects on leased land

GUIDANCE, ROUND 3

- Detailed anti-abuse provisions
- Reporting requirements





STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

The ACA has led several Opportunity Zones-focused initiatives since the last board meeting.

ACA ACTIVITIES

Opportunity Zones & Opportunity Funds Conference – Sept. 27, 2018

Hosted a full-day conference on Opportunity Zones and Funds for 400 attendees from throughout Arizona in partnership with the Council of Development Finance Agencies (CDFA).

Webinar Series on U.S. Treasury Opportunity Zones Guidance - Ongoing

Initiated a webinar series to quickly engage stakeholders on the latest guidance from the U.S. Treasury as it becomes available.

• Webinars were conducted in October 2018 and May 2019, each of which educated approximately 200 stakeholders on actionable items from U.S. Treasury guidance

Opportunity Zones Speakers Bureau:

Established a collection of experts to provide guidance for groups and communities across the state on how they can best utilize Opportunity Zones provisions to meet their specific goals.

 Presentations have been delivered at more than a dozen locations across the state in communities including Benson, Buckeye, Bullhead City, Coolidge, Eloy, Flagstaff, Mesa, Prescott Valley, Scottsdale, Superior, Tempe and Tucson

On-Demand Resources:

Created several digital resources for stakeholders to use to answer common Opportunity Zones questions and to connect with each over.





ADVANCING THE OPPORTUNITY

ARIZONA OPPORTUNITY ZONES NETWORK


The ACA has built a new tool designed to further connect Arizona's Opportunity Zones community.

The publicly searchable Arizona Opportunity Zones Network (AOZN) tool enables stakeholders to:

- Connect with experts or offer their own expertise
- Explore Opportunity Funds to invest in or share information about their own funds
- Find a project seeking funding or property for sale, or share information about their own projects or properties with potential investors.

Current Status: 80 projects in the database. We continue to gather information about our Opportunity Zones community from investors, fund sponsors, legal experts, project developers, land owners and accounting professionals. This information serves as the backbone of the AOZN.













RURAL & STATEWIDE INITIATIVES

BROADBAND: As a result of Governor Ducey's leadership, through the AMS process, the ACA created a Broadband Division to work with communities and carriers to deploy enhanced broadband connectivity to Arizona's rural regions.

Objectives:

- Leverage state resources with federal grants for both technical assistance grants and deployment grants
- Establish regional coalitions to provide local input on regional needs
- Coordinate with other state broadband construction projects
- Become the go-to resource for stakeholders to access broadband knowledge

SMALL BUSINESS: The ACA's **Small Business Ombudsman** – created by the Arizona Legislature in 2018 to serve as a liaison between small businesses and regulatory government agencies – has made progress on the following fronts:

- Established Arizona's first partnership with the Arizona Small Business Development Center (SBDC) network to provide enhanced resources to Arizona rural small businesses
- Ongoing work directly with rural communities to specifically educate them on available programs
- Conducting calls to rural small businesses jointly with SBDC representatives
- Enhanced the Small Business Checklist, the ACA's one-stop online resource for starting a business

FORESTRY: Working with U.S. Forest Service, SRP & Bureau of Reclamation and the Arizona Department of Fire and Forestry Management to solicit large scale wood products manufacturing employers to bid on the 4FRI phase II RFP.

RURAL WORKFORCE:

- Conducted Workforce Summits in rural communities to help employers leverage non-traditional sources labor
- Created a partnership with SRP & Coconino County to identify other regional employers to cross-walk displaced Navajo Generating Station employees.
