Opportunities for Employers



On-The-Job Training – Training provided under a contract with an employer who is reimbursed a percentage of the hourly wage. The participant being trained will be engaged in a job to help them prepare for long term unsubsidized employment. An On- The-Job training is intended to provide the knowledge or skills essential to meet the full and adequate performance of the job.


Work Experience/Internships – an internship or work experience is a planned, structured learning experience that takes place in a workplace for a limited period of time. Internships and other work experience may be paid or unpaid, as appropriate and consistent with other laws, such as the Fair Labor Standards Act. An internship or other work experience may be arranged within the private for profit sector, the non-profit sector, or the public sector.

Incumbent Worker Training – Training designed to help the local areas employer's workforce obtain the skills necessary to retain employment and prevent job loss. The training activities are carried out by the LWDB in conjunction with employers or a group of employers (which may include employers in partnership with other entities for delivering such training) for the purpose of assisting such workers in obtaining skills necessary to retain employment.



Arizona Career Readiness Credential

- Employability skills like dependability, communications, resilience, critical thinking, problem solving, teamwork and collaboration, attitude, and time management.
- Basic academic skills like applying mathematics in the real world; understanding workplace texts like memos, handbooks and MSDS; and interpreting workplace graphics and data like blueprints, flowcharts, and order forms.



The Arizona Career Readiness Credential validates these foundational skills that, like you, value most. Jobs seekers who hold this credential have passed four high stakes, proctored assessments that documents their understanding and application of skills and how they impact employers. Those who have trouble passing those assessments can get needed instruction at no charge.


