# Nonfarm Employment Decreased by 19,500 Jobs Over the Month in July 2020 Arizona Unemployment Rate Increased to 10.6%

The Arizona seasonally-adjusted unemployment rate increased to 10.6% in July 2020 from 10.0% in June 2020. The U.S. seasonally-adjusted unemployment rate decreased to 10.2% in July from 11.1% in June. Over the month, Arizona's seasonally adjusted labor force increased by 52,526 individuals. Over the year, labor force levels increased by 6,903 individuals or 0.2%.

## **Over the Year**

Arizona nonfarm employment decreased by 103,800 jobs or -3.6% in July. A majority of the losses were recorded in private sector employment (-99,200 jobs), while Government recorded losses of 4,600 jobs in July.

- Trade, Transportation and Utilities (6,500 jobs)
- Other Services (1,200 jobs)
- Education and Health Services (800 jobs)

Losses were reported in:

- Leisure and Hospitality (-60,600 jobs)
- Professional and Business Services (-30,000 jobs)
- Manufacturing (-7,300 jobs)
- Construction (-4,600 jobs)
- Information (-4,100 jobs)
- Financial Activities (-800 jobs)
- Natural Resources and Mining (-300 jobs)
