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Types of Employment Data Analyzed

Survey of Businesses

Current Employment Statistics

- Employment and wage estimates by industry
- Measures jobs not number of people employed
- Excludes most agriculture, self-employed, family, military and rail workers

Survey of Households

Local Area Unemployment Statistics

- Unemployment, employment and labor force levels by geographic region
- Measures people employed not number of jobs
- Excludes individuals not in the labor force



Types of Analysis Discussed

Month-Over-Month

- Numeric/Percentage Change
- <u>Issue</u>: Large influence of seasonal factors
- <u>Main Use</u>: Compare changes to previous years in the same month – comparison of previous years point-in-time estimates

Year-Over-Year

- Numeric/Percentage Change
- <u>Issue</u>: Less influence of seasonal factors
- <u>Main Use</u>: Compare changes to previous time periods – long-term trends (growing, declining, accelerating, or decelerating)



Month-Over-Month (MoM) Highlights

- The Arizona seasonally-adjusted (SA) unemployment rate increased to 8.0% in October from 6.5% in September
- The U.S. SA unemployment rate decreased to 6.9% in October from 7.9% in September
- Arizona nonfarm employment increased by 43,100 jobs, the private sector gained 43,400 jobs and Government reported a loss of 300 jobs.
- Ten of the eleven major sectors reported job gains
 - The largest gains occurred within Professional and Business Services (13,400 jobs)

September Revisions:

- September nonfarm employment gains were revised up to 32,900 jobs from 30,200 jobs
- The September SA unemployment rate was revised down to 6.5% from 6.7%



Year-Over-Year (YoY) Highlights

- Arizona nonfarm employment decreased by 73,800 jobs (-2.5%)
- Arizona private sector employment decreased by 65,100 jobs (-2.6%)
- Two of the eleven major sectors gained jobs
 - The largest gains were recorded in Trade, Transportation & Utilities (17,000 jobs) and Other Services (1,700 jobs)
- Nine of the eleven sectors recorded job losses
 - The largest losses were recorded in Leisure and Hospitality (-48,700 jobs) and Professional and Business Services (-16,700 jobs)
- Six of the seven Arizona metro areas (MSAs) lost jobs

Initial Claims:

- During the week ending October 31, 6,410 initial claims were filed.
- Arizona UI initial claims filed has been declining since the week ending August 15

Continued Claims:

- Arizona claims have been declining since the week ending August 1
- U.S. claims have continued to drop since the week ending September 5

- For the March 2020 survey, BLS began classifying anyone who was not working because of virus-related business closing as unemployed.
- BLS identified a misclassification error, in which some people were mistakenly characterized as employed rather than unemployed.
 - An unusual number of people were being counted as "employed but absent from work."
 - Typically, this category reflects vacation, family leave or other temporary absences.
- If the misclassified people had been counted as unemployed, the unemployment rate would have been higher in March-September 2020.
- In October 2020, there was no discrepancy between the official unemployment rate and the unemployment rate accounting for misclassification.

Notable Changes:

- Arizona nonfarm employment declined 2.5% YoY (-73,800 jobs) in October 2020.
- U.S. nonfarm employment declined 6.0% YoY in October 2020.

- Job gains were recorded in Employment Services (8,800 jobs or 9.0%).
 - Gains reported in Temporary Help and Professional Employer Organizations
- Job gains were recorded in Professional, Scientific and Technical Services (3,600 jobs or 3.2%)
 - Gains were reported in public relations, marketing and advertising, among others
- Job gains were recorded in Services to Buildings and Dwellings (2,800 jobs or 6.5%).

- Employment Services lost 5,200 jobs (-4.6%).
- Business Support Services lost 5,100 jobs (-12.8%).

Notable Gains:

- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services gained 2,000 jobs (1.3%).
- Services to Buildings and Dwellings gained 400 jobs (0.9%).

- Transportation and Warehousing recorded a gain of 6,300 jobs or 5.6%.
 - Gains reported in Couriers, Express Delivery, and General Warehousing
- Retail Trade recorded a gain of 4,100 jobs or 1.3%
 - Motor Vehicle and Parts gained 500 jobs
 - Food and Beverage Stores gained 400 jobs
- Wholesale Trade recorded a loss of 2,400 jobs or -2.3%.

Notable Gains:

- Transportation and Warehousing recorded a gain of 10,800 jobs (10.1%)
- Retail Trade gained 3,300 jobs (1.0%)
- Wholesale Trade recorded a gain of 2,400 jobs (2.4%)

- Local Government Education gained 1,500 jobs or 1.1%
- State Government Education gained 700 jobs or 1.2%
- Federal Government recorded a loss of 3,200 jobs or -5.1%

Notable Losses:

- State Government Education recorded a loss of 1,400 jobs (-2.3%).
- Local Government Education recorded a loss of -6,300 jobs (-4.2%).

- Food Services and Drinking Places gained 6,800 jobs or 3.2%
 - Gains reported in Full Service Restaurants and Caterers
- Arts, Entertainment and Recreation gained 1,800 jobs or 6.0%
 - Gains reported in Fitness and Recreation Sports Centers
- Accommodations gained 1,200 jobs or 3.9%

Notable Losses:

- Food Services and Drinking Places recorded a loss of 20,200 jobs (-8.4%)
- Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation experienced losses of 14,600 jobs (-31.5%)
- Accommodations recorded a loss of 13,900 jobs (-30.5%)

U.S. Leisure and Hospitality employment declined by 19.7% YoY in October 2020.

- Insurance Carriers recorded a gain of 600 jobs.
- Credit Intermediaries recorded a gain of 200 jobs.
- Real Estate, Rental, and Leasing recorded a gain of 600 jobs or 1.1%.

Notable Losses:

- Real Estate and Rental and Leasing recorded a loss of 1,300 jobs (-2.3%)
- Insurance Carriers recorded a loss of 1,400 jobs (-2.1%)

Notable Gain:

Credit Intermediaries recorded a gain of 1,300 jobs (1.4%)

- Specialty Trade Construction gained 1,300 jobs or 1.1%
- Heavy and Civil Engineering recorded a gain of 200 jobs or 1.0%
- Construction of Buildings recorded a gain of 900 jobs or 2.5%





Notable Gains:

- Specialty Trades gained 700 jobs (0.6%)
- Construction of Buildings gained 300 jobs (0.8%)

Notable Losses

• Heavy and Civil Construction lost 1,500 jobs (-7.0%)

Notable Changes:

 4,795 building permits were authorized in September 2020, up 1,158 (31.8%) permit authorizations from September 2019, and up 311 (6.9%) permit authorizations from August 2020.

- Losses were recorded in Durable Goods (-300 jobs)

- Nondurable Goods lost 1,700 jobs (-3.9%)
- Durable Goods lost 5,200 jobs (-3.9%)
 - Fabricated Metals lost 1,500 jobs (-7.2%)
 - Computer and Electronic Parts gained 1,700 jobs (5.1%)
 - Aerospace Products and Parts lost 100 jobs (-0.3%)

U.S. Manufacturing declined by 4.6% YoY in October 2020

- Healthcare and Social Assistance gained 3,000 jobs (0.8%)
 - Ambulatory Healthcare Services gained 1,700 jobs (1.0%)
 - Nursing and Residential Care Facilities gained 900 jobs (1.6%)
 - Social Assistance gained 300 jobs (0.5%)

Notable Losses:

- Social Assistance lost 3,200 jobs (-5.0%)
- Nursing and Residential Care Facilities lost 2,300 jobs (-3.8%).
- Hospitals lost 700 jobs (-0.7%).
- Educational Services lost 1,800 jobs (-2.5%)

Notable Gains:

Ambulatory Health Care Services gained 2,100 jobs (1.2%).

Report Summary

- Month-over-month, Arizona nonfarm employment increased by 43,100 jobs.
 - Ten of the eleven major sectors gained jobs.
- Year-over-year, nine major sectors lost jobs; two major sectors gained jobs.
- Year-over-year, Arizona nonfarm employment declined by 2.5%, while U.S. nonfarm employment declined by 6.0% YoY.
- The Arizona unemployment rate increased to 8.0% in October, up from 6.5% in September.
- Month-over-month, the Arizona labor force increased by 11,320 individuals (0.3%).
