Gary Tooker, former Chairman and CEO of Motorola Inc. honored with Lifetime Achievement Award alongside innovative individual, company, education and legislative award winners

Company Award Winners:

• **Pioneering Award:** <u>IO</u>, Phoenix, Arizona At a time when enterprises depend on their data center infrastructure more than ever, IO has truly brought innovation and reinvention to the data center market. With its Data Center 2.0, IO is providing enterprise-class infrastructure that can be delivered as Data Center as a Service (DCaaS) and/or rapidly deployed as a product to customer sites anywhere in the world. To manage and monitor IO's modular IO Anywhere products, IO developed the world's first secure data center infrastructure operating system, IO.OS.

- Green Innovator of the Year: <u>Solar Zone at the UA Tech Park</u>, Tucson, Arizona The concept of this 250 acre parcel at the University of Arizona Tech Park was to create an integrated, multi-dimensional research center that could foster all elements of solar energy development: generation and distribution, research and development, assembly and manufacturing, workforce training, and public education and demonstration. It is a work in progress, however the Solar Zone is already evolving as one of the leading centers for the testing, evaluation, demonstration and deployment of new solar technology in the United States.
- Innovator of the Year Start-Up Company: <u>HealthTell LLC</u>, Chandler, Arizona HealthTell's mission statement is to create a world without patients. HT combines the invention of immunosignaturing diagnostics with its development of a new chip technology to create a whole new approach to diagnostics and health monitoring. These are technologies that could transform medicine and allow for early detection of any disease.
- Innovator of the Year Small Company: <u>CellTrust Corp.</u>, Scottsdale, Arizona
 In 2012, CellTrust introduced a significant and impactful secure mobile communications solution –
 CellTrust SecureVoice. CellTrust SecureVoice builds upon SecureSMS as a Voice over IP
 service, providing the same end-to-end encryption to mobile-to-mobile voice, allowing users to
 place calls with complete confidence and security, knowing that private conversations will not be
 compromised.
- Innovator of the Year Large Company: Enghouse Interactive, Phoenix, Arizona Enghouse Interactive's [Syntellect] CIM (Customer Interaction Management) contact center suite, is a fully-featured enterprise contact center solution with an advanced management engine that enables organizations to fully control a universal queue of customer interactions of all types, including telephone and Interactive Voice Response, voicemail, email, web chat, web transactions, fax and agent tasks. The solution integrates seamlessly into the business environment and connects existing Customer Relationship Management (CRM) solutions and other back-office applications, with the contact center for a complete view of customer interactions.
- Innovator of the Year Academia: <u>ASU School of Life Sciences</u>, Tempe, Arizona Dr. Wayne Frasch, a faculty member in the School of Life Sciences at Arizona State University, has pioneered the development of a novel technology capable of rapidly detecting protein biomarkers with unprecedented sensitivity: a nanodevice, the first powered by a molecular motor. This device stretches the limits of early detection of an infection, a bioterrorist agent, or the ability to diagnose cancer.

• <u>Steve Philips</u>, Sr. Vice President, CIO, Avnet Inc.

The Chairman's Award is given once each year to an individual who has demonstrated exemplary passion, vision, and action in support of the Council. Steve Phillips, senior vice president and chief information officer for Avnet, Inc., is also chairman emeritus of the board of the Arizona Technology Council. Steve's exceptional performance, leadership and over 30 years of experience in advancing the technology sector has been instrumental in building the Council's level of engagement with its members.
