Total Nonfarm Employment Increased by 62,600 Jobs Year Over Year in March 2023 Arizona Unemployment Decreased to 3.5%

The Arizona seasonally adjusted (SA) unemployment rate decreased to 3.5% in March 2023 from 3.7% in February 2023. The U.S. SA unemployment rate decreased to 3.5% in March 2023 from 3.6% in February 2023.

Month over month, Arizona's SA labor force increased by 5,930 individuals, or 0.2%. Year over year, the SA labor force increased by 71,715 individuals, or 2.0%.

Month over month, Arizona not-seasonally adjusted (NSA) total nonfarm employment decreased by 9,800 jobs. Year over year, NSA total nonfarm employment increased by 62,600 jobs, or 2.0%. Arizona SA total nonfarm employment lost 600 jobs month over month.

Month Over Month

Arizona NSA nonfarm employment decreased by 9,800 jobs in March. Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), NSA nonfarm employment gained an average of 10,800 jobs in March. The private sector recorded a loss of 10,300 jobs in March, led by losses in Private Education & Health Services (-4,300 jobs) and Professional & Business Services (-4,100 jobs). Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), private sector employment averaged a gain of 11,200 jobs in March. The government sector¹ recorded a gain of 500 jobs in March, more than the prepandemic (2010-2019) average loss of 400 jobs. Employment gains in the government sector occurred primarily within Other Local Government (1,000 jobs).

- Manufacturing (1,800 jobs)
- Construction (1,500 jobs)
- Leisure & Hospitality (1,100 jobs)
- Government (500 jobs)


Employment losses were reported in the following sectors:

- Private Education & Health Services (-4,300 jobs)
- Professional & Business Services (-4,100 jobs)
- Financial Activities (-3,400 jobs)
- Trade, Transportation & Utilities (-2,100 jobs)

- Information (-400 jobs)


Arizona NSA nonfarm employment increased by 62,600 jobs or 2.0% in March year over year. Private sector employment increased by 52,900 jobs year over year, while government employment increased by 9,700 jobs year over year.





Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate




Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment

Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment




Arizona & U.S. Retail Trade

Year-to-Year Percent Change




Arizona & U.S. Employment Services

Year-to-Year Percent Change




Arizona & U.S. Health Care
