# Total Nonfarm Employment Increased by 67,300 Jobs Year Over Year in September 2023 Arizona Unemployment Increased to 4.0%

The Arizona seasonally adjusted (SA) unemployment rate increased to 4.0% in September 2023 from 3.8% in August 2023. The U.S. SA unemployment rate remained at 3.8% in September 2023 from August 2023.

Month over month, Arizona's SA labor force increased by 11,576 individuals, or 0.3%. Year over year, the SA labor force increased by 71,678 individuals, or 2.0%.

Month over month, Arizona not-seasonally adjusted (NSA) total nonfarm employment increased by 30,900 jobs. Year over year, NSA total nonfarm employment increased by 67,300 jobs, or 2.2%. Arizona SA total nonfarm employment increased by 8,200 individuals, or 0.3%, month over month.

## Month Over Month

Arizona NSA nonfarm employment increased by 30,900 jobs in September. Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), NSA nonfarm employment gained 28,800 jobs on average in September. The private sector recorded a gain of 14,600 jobs in September, led by gains in Private Education & Health Services (9,400 jobs) and Professional & Business Services (2,400 jobs). Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), private sector employment averaged a gain of 5,500 jobs in September. The government sector<sup>1</sup> recorded a gain of 16,300 jobs in September, less than the pre-pandemic (2010-2019) average gain of 23,300 jobs. Employment gains in the government sector occurred primarily within Local Government Education (9,400 jobs).

## Year Over Year

Arizona NSA nonfarm employment increased by 67,300 jobs or 2.2% in September year over year. Private sector employment increased by 48,000 jobs year over year, while government employment increased by 19,300 jobs year over year.
