COVID-19 Business Support: To provide resources and guidance during the pandemic, the ACA created many new services and programs including a Small Business Boot Camp Series attended by 2,680 people in FY 20, a hub for reskilling opportunities and career counseling, and two integrated marketing campaigns.

International Trade Offices: Under Governor Ducey's leadership, the ACA opened three new Arizona Trade & Investment Offices in Tel Aviv, Israel, Guanajuato, Mexico, and Chihuahua, Mexico.

2020 CEO Forum: The ACA, Governor Ducey and the Arizona Zanjeros hosted a highly successful CEO Forum event during the Waste Management Phoenix Open, attended by companies from around the U.S., resulting in several project wins to date.

Arizona Rural Broadband Development Grant: The ACA administered \$3 million in development and planning grants to three companies and four municipalities to enhance broadband connectivity statewide
