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Types of Employment Data Analyzed

Survey of Businesses

Current Employment Statistics

- Employment and wage estimates by industry
- Measures jobs not number of people
 employed
- Excludes most agriculture, self-employed, family, military and rail workers

Survey of Households

Local Area Unemployment Statistics

- Unemployment, employment and labor force levels by geographic region
- Measures people employed not number of jobs
- Excludes individuals not in the labor force



Types of Analysis Discussed

Month-Over-Month

- Numeric/Percentage Change
- Influence of seasonal trends are included
- <u>Main Use</u>: Compare changes with previous years in the same month – comparison of previous years point-in-time estimates

Year-Over-Year

- Numeric/Percentage Change
- Removes influence of seasonal trends
- <u>Main Use</u>: Compare changes with previous time periods – long-term trends (growing, declining, accelerating, or decelerating)



Month-Over-Month (MoM) Highlights

- The Arizona seasonally adjusted (SA) unemployment rate increased to 3.9% in October 2022 from 3.7% in September 2022.
- The U.S. SA unemployment rate increased to 3.7% in October 2022 from 3.5% in September 2022
- Arizona nonfarm employment increased by 31,000 jobs
 - The largest gains were recorded in Leisure & Hospitality (7,200 jobs), Trade, Transportation & Utilities (7,100 jobs), and Education & Health Services (5,300 jobs)
 - Job losses were recorded in Information (-300 jobs)
- The September 2022 nonfarm employment change was revised to a gain of 26,900 jobs from a gain of 25,200 jobs



Year-Over-Year (YoY) Highlights

- Arizona nonfarm employment increased by 105,600 jobs (3.5%)
- Arizona private sector employment increased by 100,000 jobs (3.8%), while government employment increased by 5,600 jobs (1.3%)
- Ten out of eleven major sectors recorded job gains
 - The largest gains were recorded in Education & Health Services (29,600 jobs), Leisure & Hospitality (16,900 jobs), and Manufacturing (14,800 jobs)
 - Financial Activities lost 400 jobs (-0.2%)
- All seven Arizona metro areas (MSAs) gained jobs
 - The largest percentage gains were recorded in Prescott MSA (4.3%) and Flagstaff MSA (4.0%)

During the week ending 11/12/22, 17,360 regular UI claims were filed

- UI claims were up 4.3% YoY
- UI claims were down 3,129 (-15.3%) from a comparable week in 2019 (week ending 11/16/19)

- The Arizona openings rate increased to 6.7% in Sept. 2022 from 6.5% in Aug. 2022
- The Arizona hires rate increased to 4.6% in Sept. 2022 from 3.8% in Aug. 2022

- The Arizona quits rate increased to 3.6% in Sept. 2022 from 3.4% in Aug. 2022
- The Arizona layoffs rate increased to 1.2% in Sept. 2022 from 1.0% in Aug. 2022
- The Arizona total separations rate increased to 5.0% in Sept. 2022 from 4.8% in Aug. 2022

- U.S. multiple jobholders as a percent of employed persons decreased to 4.8% in Oct. 2022 from 4.9% in Sept. 2022
- In Oct. 2019, multiple jobholders represented 5.3% of total employed persons

- US CPI increased 7.7% year-over-year (YoY) in October 2022
 - Energy prices rose 17.6% YoY
 - Food prices rose 10.9% YoY
 - Transportation prices rose 15.2% YoY
 - Housing prices rose 7.9% YoY
- Phoenix MSA CPI increased 12.1% YoY in October 2022
 - Energy prices rose 23.4% YoY
 - Food prices rose 12.6% YoY
 - Transportation prices rose 13.3% YoY
 - Housing prices rose 16.5% YoY
 - Rent of primary residence rose 21.1%

- Professional and Business Services gained 5,000 jobs (1.1%)
 - Administrative & Waste Services gained 4,400 jobs (1.9%)
 - Services to Business & Dwellings gained 1,100 jobs (2.6%)
 - Employment Services gained 1,000 jobs (1.0%)
 - Business Support Services lost 700 jobs (-2.3%)
 - Job losses reported in Telemarketing and Other Contact Centers

- Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services gained 10,800 jobs (6.2%)
- Management of Companies gained 2,300 jobs (6.7%)

Notable Losses:

- Business Support Services lost 4,400 jobs (-13.0%)
- Employment Services lost 4,100 jobs (-3.8%)
- Services to Buildings & Dwellings lost 1,900 jobs (-4.2%)

 - Clothing & Accessories gained 400 jobs (2.3%)
- Wholesale Trade gained 700 jobs (0.7%)

 - Other State Government lost 1,500 jobs (-3.9%)
- Federal Government lost 500 jobs (-0.9%)

- State Government gained 1,300 jobs (1.4%)
- Federal Government gained 100 jobs (0.2%)





Arizona Financial Activities

Highlights:

- Real Estate, Rental, and Leasing gained 1,300 jobs (2.3%)
- Insurance Carriers gained 1,400 jobs (2.0%)
 - Gains come from Insurance Agencies and Brokerages and Third Party Administration of Insurance and Pension Funds
- Credit Intermediaries lost 400 jobs (-0.4%)
 - Losses occurred within Commercial Banking and Real Estate Credit

Arizona Financial Activities

Notable Losses:

- Credit Intermediaries lost 1,600 jobs (-1.6%)
- Insurance Carriers lost 700 jobs (-1.0%)

Notable Gains:

- Real Estate, Rental, and Leasing gained 1,100 jobs (1.9%)
- Financial Investments and Vehicles gained 800 jobs (3.9%)

Highlights:

- Construction of Buildings gained 600 jobs (1.6%)
- Heavy & Civil Engineering Construction gained 100 jobs (0.5%)
- Speciality Trade Construction lost 100 jobs (-0.1%)
 - Losses were reported in Residential Framing Contractors and Residential Drywall and Insulation Contractors, among others.

Note:

Below-average gains in Oct. 2022 follow above-average gains in Aug. & Sept. 2022

- Aug. 2022 change: 2,100 jobs
- Pre-pandemic avg Aug. change: 500 jobs
- Sept. 2022 change: 1,100 jobs
- Pre-pandemic avg Sept. change: -400 jobs

- Specialty Trades Construction gained 7,000 jobs (5.8%)
- Construction of Buildings gained 1,500 jobs (4.0%)
- Heavy and Civil Construction gained 900 jobs (4.5%)

Notable Changes:

- Building permits decreased by 0.7% in September 2022 from August 2022
- 4,840 building permits were authorized in September 2022, a decrease of 318 permits (-6.2%) from September 2021

Housing Inventory: Active Listing Count in Arizona Not Seasonally Adjusted



- The count of active home listings increased by 1,462 (6.1%) in Oct. 2022 from Sept. 2022
- Active home listings are up 14,559 (136.1%) in Oct. 2022 from Oct. 2021



Housing Inventory: Median Days on Market in Arizona Not Seasonally Adjusted



- Month-over-month, the median days property listings spent on the market increased by 4 days or 8%
 - Up to 52 days in Oct. 2022 from 48 days in Sept. 2022
- Year-over-year, the median days on market increased by 18 days or 53%
 - Up to 52 days in Oct. 2022 from 34 days in Oct. 2022



Housing Inventory: Median Listing Price in Arizona,

U.S. Dollars, Monthly, Seasonally Adjusted



- The median listing price decreased to \$470,000 in Oct. 2022 from \$477,500 in Sept. 2022
- The median listing price increased 4.4% YoY in Oct. 2022



S&P/Case-Shiller AZ-Phoenix Home Price Index, Index Jan 2000=100, Monthly, Seasonally Adjusted



- The Home Price Index decreased MoM in August 2022 to 336 from 343 in July 2022
- The Home Price Index increased 17.1% in August 2022 from August 2021

- Nondurable Goods gained 400 jobs (0.8%)
- Durable Goods gained 200 (0.1%)
 - Computer & Electronic Parts gained 300 jobs (0.9%)
 - Gains were reported in Semiconductor and Related Device Manufacturing
 - Fabricated Metal gained 100 jobs (0.4%)
 - Aerospace Parts lost 1,200 jobs (-3.6%)
 - Losses were reported in Guided Missile and Space Vehicle Manufacturing

- Durable Goods gained 10,700 jobs or 7.8%
 - Computer and Electronic Parts gained 2,700 jobs (8.3%)
 - Aerospace Products and Parts gained 2,400 jobs (8.1%)
 - Fabricated Metal gained 1,100 jobs (5.1%)
- Nondurable Goods gained 4,100 jobs (9.1%)

 - Gains were reported in Colleges, Universities, Professional, Elementary and Secondary Schools
- Hospitals gained 1,000 jobs (1.0%)
 - Gains were reported in General Medical and Surgical Hospitals
- Nursing and Residential Care Facilities gained 200 jobs (0.4%)
- Social Assistance gained 800 jobs (1.2%)

Report Summary

- Month-over-month, Arizona nonfarm employment increased by 31,000 jobs
- Year-over-year, Arizona nonfarm employment increased by 3.5% and U.S. nonfarm employment increased by 3.4%
 - Ten out of eleven major sectors recorded job gains
 - All seven Arizona metro areas gained jobs
- The Arizona unemployment rate increased to 3.9%, month-over-month
- The Arizona labor force increased by 9,516 individuals, month-over-month
