Total Nonfarm Employment Increased by 102,900 Jobs Year Over Year in May 2022 Arizona Unemployment Remained at 3.2%


The Arizona seasonally adjusted unemployment rate remained at 3.2% from April 2022 to May 2022. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate did not change over the month, remaining at 3.6% in May 2022. Month over month, Arizona's seasonally adjusted labor force increased by 12,691 individuals or 0.4%. Year over year, the labor force increased by 50,012 individuals or 1.4%. Month over month, Arizona total nonfarm employment decreased by 5,500 jobs or 0.2%. Year over year, total nonfarm employment increased by 102,900 jobs or 3.5%.

Month Over Month

Arizona nonfarm employment decreased by 5,500 jobs or 0.2% in May. Prior to the pandemic, nonfarm employment averaged a loss of 6,700 jobs in May (2010-2019). The government sector¹ recorded a loss of 6,700 jobs in May, more than the pre-pandemic (2010-2019) average loss of 5,700 jobs. Government sector job losses occurred within State and Local Government Education, which reported seasonal losses because of the end of the school year. The private sector recorded a gain of 1,200 jobs in May, led by gains in Leisure & Hospitality. Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), private sector employment averaged a loss of 1,000 jobs in May, with losses historically recorded in Leisure & Hospitality and Professional & Business Services. In May 2022, Professional & Business Services lost 2,000 jobs, which is in line with its pre-pandemic average loss of 1,700 jobs. Trade, Transportation & Utilities recorded a larger-than-usual loss in May.







Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate Seasonally Adjusted




Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment Year-to-Year Percent Change
