

AT-A-GLANCE: BEAD PERMITTING AGENCIES

Broadband Equity, Access and Deployment (BEAD) Program

BEAD-funded broadband projects require permits from multiple agencies before construction. This document outlines common **federal** and **state** permits in Arizona.

IMPORTANT: Additional tribal, county, municipal, or utility permits may apply and must be identified by subgrantees. This resource is advisory only.

US Department of Interior

Bureau of Land Management



Oversees federal public lands.



Right of Way

Bureau of Reclamation



Manages water resource management.



Use Authorization

Bureau of Indian Affairs



Supports tribal governments.

US National Park Service



Federal Agencies

Manages National Parks and conserves the nation's natural and cultural resources.



Construction Permit, Right of Way

US Fish and Wildlife Service



Oversees the conservation a management of fish, wildlife, plants, and their habitats.



<u>Special Purpose – Utility, Eagle</u> Disturbance and Nest Take Permits

US Army Corps of Engineers



Manages the nation's water resources and protects the environment through engineering expertise.



Regional General Permit, Nationwide Permit

US Forest Service



Conducts conservation and stewardship of resources on National Forests and Grasslands.



Special Use Form 299

Arizona Department of Transportation



Manages state highways and transportation programs for aviation, intercity passenger services, rail freight, and local transit.



Right of Way, Encroachment

Arizona State Land Department



Manages State Trust lands, overseeing permits and land use for broadband and other infrastructure projects.



Right of Way, Right of Entry

Arizona Game and Fish Department



State Agencies

Manages and conserves the state's wildlife, habitats, and outdoor recreation resources for public benefit.



Right of Entry

Arizona Department of Environmental Quality



Oversees environmental protection and compliance, including air, water, waste regulations for projects across the state.



Pollution Discharge Construction Permit

Arizona State Parks & Trails / State Historic Preservation Office



Manages state parks, natural areas, and historic sites, and oversees permits for projects affecting these resources. The <u>Section 106</u> consultation process does not result in a permit issuance.
