Total Nonfarm Employment Increased by 48,600 Jobs Year Over Year in May 2023 Arizona Unemployment Remained Unchanged at 3.4%

The Arizona seasonally adjusted (SA) unemployment rate remained unchanged at 3.4% in May 2023 from April 2023. This is the lowest SA statewide unemployment rate going back to 1976 under the current estimation methodology. The U.S. SA unemployment rate increased to 3.7% in May 2023 from 3.4% in April 2023.

Month over month, Arizona's SA labor force increased by 8,964 individuals, or 0.2%. Year over year, the SA labor force increased by 62,566 individuals, or 1.7%.

Month over month, Arizona not-seasonally adjusted (NSA) total nonfarm employment decreased by 19,100 jobs. Year over

year, NSA total nonfarm employment increased by 48,600 jobs, or 1.6%. Arizona SA total nonfarm employment decreased by 3,300 individuals, or -0.1%, month over month.

Month Over Month

Arizona NSA nonfarm employment decreased by 19,100 jobs in May. Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), NSA nonfarm employment lost 6,700 jobs on average in May. The private sector recorded a loss of 14,600 jobs in May, led by losses in Professional & Business Services (-7,200 jobs) and Financial Activities (-3,800 jobs). Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), private sector employment averaged a loss of 900 jobs in May. The government sector¹ recorded a loss of 4,500 jobs in May, less than the pre-pandemic (2010-2019) average loss of 5,700 jobs. Employment losses in the government sector occurred primarily within State Government Education (-5,300 jobs).



Arizona NSA nonfarm employment increased by 48,600 jobs or 1.6% in May year over year. Private sector employment increased by 34,900 jobs year over year, while government employment increased by 13,700 jobs year over year.







Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate




Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment

Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment




Arizona & U.S. Retail Trade

Year-to-Year Percent Change




Arizona & U.S. Employment Services

Year-to-Year Percent Change




Arizona & U.S. Health Care
