ABOUT THIS REPORT

This report was created to assist Arizona Local Workforce Development Areas in completing their 2024-2027 Local Workforce Development Plans; the information provided in this report is intended to be used as a resource in the planning process. The report summarizes key demographic, labor market, and workforce trends occurring within the state and local economy.

ABOUT THE ARIZONA OFFICE OF ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY (OEO)

The Office of Economic Opportunity (OEO) is the State of Arizona's statistics agency. Arizona's economic potential is revealed through evidence-based statistics compiled by OEO. The OEO improves analytic capacity and tracks Arizona's key economic indicators, such as the state's labor market, population, and regulatory and taxation.

Labor Market

OEO serves as Arizona's workforce planning coordinator, and provides operational, strategic, and research support to the Workforce Arizona Council and other key workforce partners in this role.

Population

OEO produces the official population estimates and projections for the State of Arizona including demographics.

Regulatory and Tax

OEO monitors Arizona's tax and regulatory competitiveness by collecting and quantifying tax and regulatory activities. This work provides baseline information that can be used to make informed decisions about the state of regulation and taxation in Arizona.

Changes in population can have a large impact on a local economy. An area experiencing population growth, particularly growth in working-age populations, may experience an increase in economic activity¹ and workforce diversity.

- Arizona had one of the fastest growing populations in the United States from 2020-2021, ranking 3rd among all U.S. states in numeric growth and 4th in percent growth.²
- Mohave and La Paz County accounted for 3.2 percent of Arizona's population in 2021.
- In 2021, twenty-one percent of individuals who moved to Mohave County and 15 percent of individuals who moved to La Paz County from a different U.S. state were prime-working age adults (25 to 54 years).³

POPULATION

Population projections provide useful insight into an area's future demand for resources and services.⁴ An area experiencing population declines may choose to focus efforts on filling current job positions, while an area experiencing population growth may choose to focus on job creation. Further analysis into the composition of growing or declining populations can be a useful next step.

• Arizona is projected to add more than 487,155 people to its population from 2022-2026, growing by an annualized rate of 1.6 percent.

- This population gain is projected to come from net migration.

It is important to understand the employment barriers faced by those served when developing workforce strategies. Population characteristics can help illuminate vulnerable segments of an area's population. An area with population characteristics that differ significantly from state or national averages may need to consider what best meets the needs of their unique population.

- The labor force participation rates in Mohave and La Paz Counties were significantly lower than the state and national rates.
- Median household income was significantly lower in Mohave and La Paz County when compared with the state and nation; this is reflected in an increased percentage of families in poverty for each area.
- Mohave and La Paz Counties saw a higher median age than the state and nationwide median.
- There is a larger percent of individuals with a disability in Mohave and La Paz Counties than in Arizona and the United States.

Highest Education Achieved, 2021, Population Over 25 Years of Age



Understanding the current educational attainment of your local area's available workforce is a crucial step in identifying job seeker and business needs. Education is an important element in determining job success, and, oftentimes, can lead directly to higher-paying jobs and lower rates of unemployment.⁵

- Eighty-seven percent of Mohave County residents and 84 percent of La Paz County Residents aged 25 and over have graduated from high school, less than the statewide rate of 88 percent.
- Comparatively, the percentage population with a bachelor's degree or higher in Mohave County is 16 percent less than the statewide rate, while La Paz County's is 19 percent less than the state.


WORKFORCE



Unemployment Rate Comparisons, Sep 2012-Sep 2022, Not-Seasonally Adjusted

- Mohave and La Paz Counties' unemployment rate for the past 10 years has trended slightly above the statewide rate.
- Mohave County's labor force level increased from an annual average of 86,573 in 2020 to an annual average of 87,214 in 2021.
- La Paz County's labor force level decreased from an annual average of 8,671 in 2020 to an annual average of 8,615 in 2021.
- In 2021, there was an annual average of 4,833 unemployed people in Mohave County, compared with 6,604 unemployed people in 2020.
- In 2021, there was an annual average of 441 unemployed people in La Paz County, compared with 525 unemployed people in 2020.
- The average unemployment rate in Mohave County during 2021 was 5.5 percent, 2.2 percent lower than the average from the previous nine years.
- The average unemployment rate in La Paz County during 2021 was 5.1 percent, 1.7 percent lower than the average from the previous nine years.


Unemployment Rate by Educational Attainment, 2021, Ages 25-64

Historically, higher educational attainment levels have been associated with lower levels of unemployment.⁶ Understanding the relationship between unemployment and education can help determine which education levels are most in need of targeted workforce efforts.

- The unemployment rate among individuals with less than a high school diploma, or with a bachelor's degree or higher, was significantly higher in La Paz County than in the state or nation.
- The unemployment rate was higher across all levels of educational attainment in Mohave County than in Arizona, with the exception of those with a bachelor's degree or higher.
- The unemployment rate was higher across all levels of educational attainment in La Paz County than in Arizona, with the exception of those with a high school diploma.

- Arizona saw an annualized increase of 2.2 percent in total nonfarm employment from 2012-2022.
- Mohave County's average total nonfarm employment increased by 10,598 jobs from 2012-2022, an annualized increase of 2.1 percent over this 10-year period; La Paz County's average total nonfarm employment increased by 453 jobs, an annualized increase of 0.8 percent.
- Since 2012, Mohave County's job growth has generally trended below the state's growth rate and La Paz County's growth rate has been much more volatile.

- Nine of the private-sector industries in Mohave and La Paz Counties recorded employment growth from 2016 to 2021, resulting in a total increase of 3,641 jobs.
- Of the 10 private-sector industries, Education and Health Services made up the largest share of employment in 2021.
- Construction experienced the largest numeric growth from 2016 to 2021.

Job skills are constantly evolving with the emergence of new technologies and changing consumer habits. Job seekers can better prepare themselves by gaining skills within industries projected to have large employment needs.

- All 10 private sectors in Mohave and La Paz Counties are projected to experience growth through 2023.
- Leisure and Hospitality is projected to lead growth (7.1 percent), followed by Financial Activities (4.1 percent).
- Trade Transportation and Utilities is projected to remain the industry that employs the most people in Mohave and La Paz Counties.
